

Author Interview: Colonel Matt Jackson




It's truly enlightening to get inside an author's head to understand their background and how it shapes what they publish. Catch Colonel Matt Jackson's interview on our <u>website</u> where he discusses his first book in the Undaunted Valor Series, **Undaunted Valor, An Assault Helicopter Unit in Vietnam**. It's best described as a historical novel covering events from 1968 when Matt joined the Army through 1970 when he completed 18 months of combat helicopter flying.

It is classified as fictional, but the conversations are close to

what was said at times. Some characters' names have been changed and the foul language was toned down as were certain events. Jackson's goal is to encourage others to tell their story, perhaps as a way to better deal with stress from traumatic events.

It must be mentioned that the first book in the Undaunted Valor series is a Top Seller on Amazon's Best Seller's list and has a 4.7 out of 5-star rating with almost 3,400 reviews! If you want more Undaunted Valor, this book is the first in a series of six books. The series continues through to **Battle of Kontum, 1972**, which was published this year. The last three books in the series pay tribute to the US advisors that served with the South Vietnamese Army during the Easter Offensive of 1972.

Confirmation of the popularity of this series is the fact that a motion picture based on the third book is on its way to the studios. Jackson's current project is a three-book series on the Korean War. All of Jackson's books are on <u>Amazon</u>.
